Office Memorandum

**Subject: Facilitation of trade through “Green Corridor” between Oman and Dubai**

The undersigned is directed to refer to the ongoing deliberations under the Inter-Ministerial Group (IMG) on Supply Chain Resilience regarding trade disruptions arising from evolving geopolitical developments in the Middle East.

2. In this context, it is informed that Dubai Customs, in coordination with the Sultanate of Oman, has operationalized a “Green Corridor” to facilitate the movement of diverted shipments via land routes, thereby ensuring smoother trade flows and minimizing supply chain bottlenecks.
3. The Green Corridor provides for expedited customs clearance, bonded movement of containerised and air cargo shipments through Oman to Dubai, and ensures operational continuity by offering an efficient alternative to maritime routes affected by prevailing disruptions.
4. All Export Promotion Councils (EPCs) are requested to:
  - Advise their members to utilize the Green Corridor facility, wherever feasible;
  - Disseminate relevant customs procedures and logistical protocols among stakeholders; and
  - Encourage coordination between exporters and logistics service providers for effective utilization of this mechanism.
